"INTRODUCING A UNIFIED APPROACH FOR THERAPEUTIC TEAMS FOR THE TREATMENT OF CULTURALLY DIVERSE PATIENTS IN DIFFICULT AND NON-STANDARD SITUATIONS"

- 1. Type of article. (Original Articles or Review Articles)
- 2. Title of the article should contain brief but informative content.
 - With Capital and lowercase letters, font "Times New Roman", font size max 10 pages, Alignment "Justified", line spacing "Single".

Name Lastname (1), Name Lastname (2),

- Department . . ., Faculty . . ., University, City and Country.
- **3.** Abstracts should be 250 words, structured with introduction, purpose, material and methods, results, Conclusion / Abstract in English/
- **4.** Keywords up to 6 /in English/.

The article follows the same structure as the abstract, a total volume of up to 6 pages. Justified alignment, single line spacing for the entire manuscript.

REFERENCES:

- It is recommended that at least 30% of the references be published in the last 5 (five) years.
- List all authors when there are six or less; when there are seven or more, list only the first six and add "etc."
- Use the reference style in Vancouver, which is known as the system. The list of references should be included after the last section of the main text of the article. The literature used must be listed in numerical order and in the same order in which they were first mentioned in the text (not in alphabetical order). The list of references should include all and only those references that you quoted in the text. Do not include unpublished items as correspondence. Use Arabic numbers (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9) to identify a reference unit that is the same as the inscription number quoted in the corresponding citation in the text.
